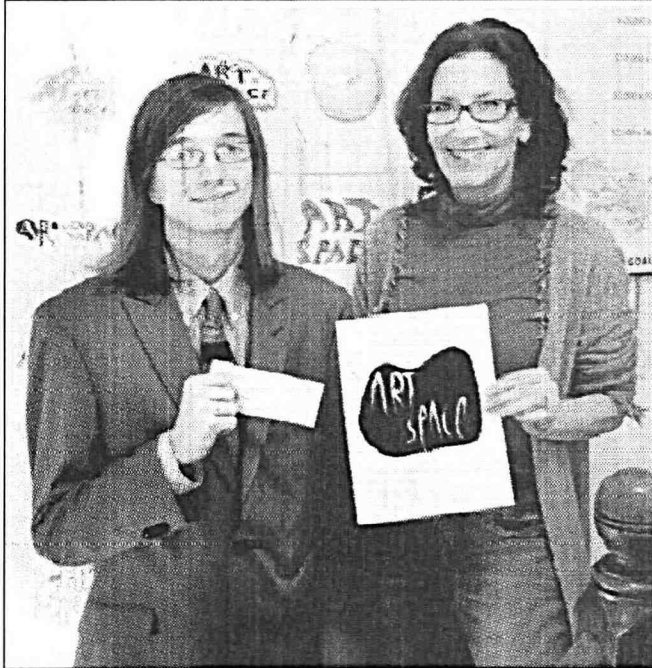

Hanson wins logo contest

Hopkinton High School student Zachary Hanson, 17, won the Hopkinton Center for the Arts, Arts Space logo contest, and received a \$100 check earlier this month.

The design was selected from 27 entries by middle and high school students.

"We appreciate that his logo is not a literal translation of an art, theater and music space, but strongly implies the process of creation," Kris Waldman, ar-

tistic director at HCA wrote in a press release. "Its resemblance to a palette or a scratch board conveys the sense of a space where creativity is boundless. It is a bold, easily-read mark that we will be thrilled to use as we launch the new program."

Art Space is a new after-school program HCA is initiating this spring that will use art as a positive activity for teens who may or may not be engaged in tradition-

al after-school activities. There will be five weekly three-hour sessions in visual arts, music and theater.

The program was made possible by a grant from the Foundation for MetroWest. The Foundation is an organization that promotes philanthropy in the region, helps donors maximize the impact of their local giving, serves as a resource for local nonprofit organization and enhances the quality of life for all of its citizens.
