Drumlin Farm receives \$10k grant

The Foundation for MetroWest announced today that Mass Audubon's Drumlin Farm in Lincoln, is receiving a grant totaling \$10,000 as part of their 2011 grant cycle. The award was made today at an event held at Mass Audubon's Broadmoor Wildlife Sanctuary in Natick, where a total of \$162,000 was distributed to organizations throughout the region.

Mass Audubon was awarded the grant to support their wetland science programming through the

construction of platforms to allow visitors to explore the water's edge of the Ice Pond while protecting the fragile shoreline. Wetland programs at Drumlin Farm serve nearly 4,000 participants each year.

"The MetroWest is defined by the strength of organizations, such as Mass Audubon's Drumlin Farm, working tirelessly to improve the quality of life in communities throughout the region," said Judith Salerno, executive director of Foundation for MetroW-

est. "Each year we are incredibly moved by the aspiration of these organizations to serve their communities and we are proud to be able to support them in a small, but meaningful way."
